INTRODUCTION

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

2. Why do you think the woman who was caught in adultery in John 8:1-12 was in the darkest moment of her life?
3. How do you think the woman felt when they made her stand before the crowd and publicly announced her sin?
4. How do you feel when someone publicly or privately exposes a sin in your life?
5. In verse 6 we are told Jesus knelt down and wrote on the ground. There is no way of knowing for sure, but what do you think Jesus was writing?
6. As the crowd began to leave, what do you think the woman was feeling?
7. Can you remember a time when you were definitely wrong and someone forgave you? How did that make you feel?
8. What does it mean to you that Jesus is the light of the world?

CONCLUSION

Pastor Paul stated in his message, “unless we see ourselves as sinners, we won’t see our need for a Savior.” No matter how dark your world seems right now, Jesus is the light. And in a moment of time, His light can illuminate your darkness, His grace can forgive your sins, His presence can bring healing to your shame.
